Pre k went to gymnastics, has done animal yoga, a weekly book and song, learning numerals, shapes, and colors.

Kindergarten - Ms. Thomson

This is what we've been doing in kinder:

We are working on blending and segmenting words, sight words and rhyming. We are working in our journals drawing, labeling, and printing words and sentences. We will also be finishing our work on 2D and 3D shapes and will start our work on measurement.

# Grade 1 - Mrs. McEachren (1Mc)/Ms. Warmington (1W)

Grade One had a wonderful visit from 2 African black-footed penguins, Sweet Pea and Chanel. Students asked and answered lots of questions and then wrote about what they learned in their journals. As well, we are integrating Science into Language Arts by talking about the changes that take place during the Spring. We also celebrated earth day by making binoculars and bird feeders from recycled materials.

In math, we are working on place value activities within 100. This will take us until at least the end of April.

In Science we are learning about Energy.

We will be going on our field trip to the Fort Precinct in Fort Saskatchewan on June  $18^{th}$ . Thank you to PSS for making this trip possible for us.

# Grade 2 - Mrs. Roe (2R)/Ms. Tower (2T)
